WhatsApp made group calls to eight people in beta on April 21 after previously announcing support for four people. Now, group video and audio search for you and seven friends have been released to both iOS and Android public. According to the app's iOS release notes for version 2.20.50: Group video and voice calls now support 8 participants. All participants must be in the latest version of WhatsApp. visual enhancements for iOS 13 users, including the updated message action menu. The iOS update is now available from the App Store and will likely be shown as an automatic update for most users. For this to work with friends and family, they must also be running the latest version of WhatsApp on their own devices. Group video and voice calls start from the Calls tab in the lower-left corner of the WhatsApp app. A call icon (a phone with a plus sign) can be selected at the top right, and in the latest version of WhatsApp you will see "New Group Search". Tap this and select up to seven participants, then you can choose whether to start a video or voice call.
